Salmon Safari

Come join Off Campus for an autumn hike at the Seattle Mountaineers Kitsap Branch located at 3000 Seabeck Highway, Bremerton. We will gather at the Kitsap Cabin, built in 1918 by Mountaineer volunteers, at 12:30 p.m. and start our adventure with a storyteller who will share salmon-themed stories. We will

then hike to view salmon, led by a qualified expert who will present age-appropriate information along the trail and at the creek side. The cost of this fun-filled adventure is \$6.50 per student/child 4 years and up. Parents are free. The hike does not accommodate strollers.

The Dancing Brush

Off Campus will participate in a unique art experience at The Dancing Brush, on Friday, December 4th. Our painting session will begin at 1:00 p.m. and last one and one half hours.

Students will have a choice to paint a 4" tile (\$10.86), an ornament (\$13.04), a plate (\$17.38), or a bowl (\$18.47). The price includes the cost of the studio time, supplies needed for your child to complete their special work of art, and a tour of the kiln-area. There is an optional frame that may be purchased to house your 4" tile at \$9.00 plus tax; this would

make the total cost of the tile and frame \$20.64.

The deadline for this fieldtrip is Wednesday, November 25th.

Parents may drop off their 2nd grade and older students, to be supervised by Off Campus staff. However, kindergarten and 1st graders will need to be supervised by a parent or guardian. The Dancing Brush is located at 18846 Front Street in Poulsbo.

Federal Impact Aid Survey

Every year the District must apply for Federal Impact Aid funds from the U.S. Department of Education. These funds compensate CKSD for the loss of local tax dollars from tax-exempt federal property in the Silverdale and Bremerton area.

The District must conduct a Federal Residence and Em-

ployment Survey on a yearly basis in order to obtain a current count of families in the District who live and/or work on federal property. On November 3, 2008, the survey form used for this count will be mailed home. **It is important that all appropriate sections on the form be filled out completely and accurately and the**

form is signed and dated.

Your cooperation in assisting the District in this matter is greatly appreciated. It is important that we receive a form for each student. **Please return forms as soon as possible, either to our office or to the enrichment office on Wednesday.**

Please don't forget to return the Federal Impact Aid Survey forms. We need a form signed, dated and returned for each student as soon as possible. Forms will be mailed on November 2nd.

Enrichment Classes (9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.)

Kindergarten with Mrs. Caldwell

In November, we will continue through the alphabet with letters E,F,G, and study the seasons and Thanksgiving.

First Grade with Mrs. Kreifels

In first grade during November, we will work on writing in our journals, learn about Veteran's Day, and continue addition and subtraction stories in math. We will also be talking about family traditions. Please remember to bring a backpack each week.

Second Grade with Mrs. Ryan

We will wrap up our unit on mysteries this month. Then we will do some fun reading, writing and social studies activities connected to the first Thanksgiving.

Third Grade with Mrs. Gaines

During the month of November, we will continue to work on a special gift that the students will be giving their families in December. We will continue to work on multiplication concepts and using pictures, numbers, and words to describe our thinking in math. In writing, we'll begin journal writing and take time to share student writing.

Using *6-Trait Writing*, students will use the writing process and work on the trait of *Ideas*. They'll also learn about similes and metaphors. In math, students will continue to problem solve and learn to carefully read and understand a problem, work to a solution, verify the reasonableness of the answer, and communicate the answer effectively.

Fifth Grade with Mr. Menefee

Mr. Menefee's 5th graders will continue their exploration of *Variables* in science.

Sixth Grade with Mr. Kaech

We will be finishing our study of several major nations of Europe. The *Time for Kids* news magazine arriving at home can be used as a good starting point for family discussions on current events. Your son/daughter is doing an excellent job of returning their completed projects. Thank You.

7th & 8th grades with Mrs. Brown

Students will begin each class with a trip to the gym. Upon their return they will challenge their brains by solving some Plexer puzzles. The next activity will be the Scope[®] magazine. Scope[®] is a timely teen-oriented magazine that is packed with engaging Readers Theater plays, classic and contemporary literature, as well as nonfiction and the ever-popular, first-person true teen stories. Additionally, students will spend time exploring geography concepts.

First Saturday Family Day at the Keyport Naval Undersea Museum

The Naval Undersea Museum at Keyport is inviting families with pre-school to age 12 children to Family Day the first Saturday of the month. Each family day will include an experiment or make and take craft project, a story and song time, and a tour of the galleries. Family day begins at 10:00 a.m. and ends with the tour about noon. Parents must accompany children.

On November 7th, the topic is Sound in the Sea. Experiment with all kinds of sound. Make a string telephone and learn how sound travels in the undersea. Try the sound powered phones!

On December 5th, the topic will be Creatures of the Deep. Paint your own Squish Fish, learn about the unusual creatures that live in the depths of the ocean and also the submersibles that helped discover these creatures.

From Highway 3, take the Keyport exit onto Highway 308. Follow the signs to the museum located at 1 Garnett Way, Keyport.

Off Campus Student Identification Cards
